CLASS SCHEDULES

Accommodations for the school are booked through the Yukon Federation of Labour Registration Process and must be confirmed before July 24, 2024.

Room Rate is \$255.00 per night plus taxes & fees, based on single or double occupancy. A \$10.00 charge applies for each adult over double occupancy, to a maximum of 4 persons per room. Rates are subject to all taxes and fees. Individuals will be responsible for all incidental charges.

SPOUSES/GUESTS

REGISTRATION DEADLINE TO SECURE HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS AT THIS RATE IS JULY 24, 2024.

Yukon Union School, August 25-29, 2024 Courses

A PATH TO RECONCILIATION: STANDING IN SOLIDARITY WITH YUKON FIRST NATIONS

This course is for all workers to learn the history of the Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island (North America) facilitated by Indigenous labour activists. Its purpose is to build meaningful, long-term relationships among Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples inside and outside of our workplaces, to acknowledge labours' commitment to Truth and Reconciliation. This course looks at understanding the Self Governing First Nations in Yukon and the increase of Indigenous peoples' representation in our workplaces and in our unions.

Participants do not need any previous experience and are encouraged to bring open minds and hearts.

FACING MANAGEMENT WITH CONFIDENCE

This course will look at economic, political, and social forces at play between union and management. It will examine the roles and rights of each group and the different types of union/ management relationships and styles. We will look at the power, bias, and privilege dynamics between union and management and how we can communicate effectively. We will focus on problem solving – understanding issues, developing strategies, finding and presenting facts and argument, finding areas of agreement, building solutions, implementing and maintaining solutions. Participants can expect lots of participation, interaction, and role-plays along with practical skills and tools for communication, analysis, strategy, and critical thinking.

SHOP STEWARDS: HEROS WITHOUT CAPES

The steward is often the main point of contact between the union, its members, management, and the larger labour movement. This course builds the skills, confidence, and knowledge a steward needs to represent their members. Participants will deepen their understanding of their position as stewards, the handling of grievances and complaints, problem-solving skills, protecting contractual provisions in the collective agreement, and current issues for stewards. You will practise more advanced grievance handling skills using real life case studies and role plays. The course will deal with procedures before the process of arbitration. Please bring your collective agreement with you. Knowledge of the first stages of the grievance procedure will be assumed.

WOMEN IN LEADERSHIP

This course is open to any leaders who identify as women or who are gender diverse, including non-binary, gender fluid, gender-nonconforming, or genderqueer leaders. This course offers an opportunity to develop and enhance their leadership skills and knowledge in a variety of current and emerging labour issues. A major component of the course will cover communication and motivational skills that are important for women activists. Participants will explore ways of building on their skills and drawing on their experiences as they advance along the path to leadership and consider running for an elected position or supporting others who run. Whether you're thinking of leadership within your union, your community, or in politics, this course is for you.

COURSE SELECTION AND CHANGES - REGISTER EARLY!

Participants will select the courses from the list outlined in the brochure and will be registered in their first choice (on a first-come, first-served basis). The registration process will ask for a first and second choice. Participants will only be placed in their second choice if the class size limit has been reached or their first-choice course is cancelled. If participants wish to change courses, they must notify the YFL at finance@yukonfed.com.

COURSE CANCELLATIONS

Should a course be cancelled due to low enrollment, participants will be placed in their second choice. If this is not possible, they will be notified of the cancellation.

PREPARE FOR REGISTRATION

- Registrants must have the approval of their union before registering.

Many of the courses require access to a Wi-Fi-enabled laptop or tablet. If possible, we recommend that participants bring their laptop and/or tablet (and charging cables) with them to Union School.

PARTICIPANT CONDUCT

Participants to the Union School should understand that a high standard of behaviour is expected of them. The YFL and CLC work to provide a supportive working and learning environment that gives equal opportunity to all students. This atmosphere is based on the principles of fairness and respect. Specifically, harm, harassment, intolerant acts, or derogatory remarks will not be tolerated. Behaviour that undermines the dignity or self-esteem of any individual, or creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment, whether it be sexual, racial or any other form of personal harassment, will not be tolerated, nor condoned, and may result in the delegate being removed from the school and a letter forwarded to their local union.

The indigenous setting of the Union School requires participants to show the utmost respect for the land, environment, places, and people they encounter. All participants deserve the opportunity to enjoy the Union School. Interactions in the community will reflect greatly on any future potential opportunities and community engagement for our unions in Yukon.

NAME BADGES

Name badges will be provided to all attendees. The badges identify participants as people entitled to be part of the Union School group and are also used for security purposes. Name badges are required for all YFL evening activities. Participants must ensure they always have their badges with them.

WHAT TO WEAR

The dress code is casual or business casual. Each day participants will have to travel between their hotel/home and the school, so it's important to bring appropriate attire for the weather. The end of August is still typically very nice weather for Yukoners, but if participants are coming from southern climates they may want to bring some layers. For activities, they may want to bring sports or swim attire to enjoy walking trails, fitness centres or hot springs in their leisure time.

EQUITY-SEEKING GROUPS

The policy of the YFL and CLC is one of affirmative action and equity. Caucus meetings may be held throughout the week for members who identify as persons with disabilities, racially visible, Indigenous, 2SLGBTQIA+, Women, or Young Workers (30 years old or less).

ACCESSIBILITY

The Sternwheeler Hotel and Kwanlin Dun Cultural Centre are accessible. However, there are sometimes concerns about the ease of accessible transportation and pathways through downtown Whitehorse. Participants are to indicate any special needs on the registration form. Every effort will be made to provide access and specified services.
